Half a century later Tertullian adds, 'We are but of yesterday, and yet we already fill your cities, islands, camps, your palace, senate, and forum. We have left you only your temples.' R. H. Glover (The Progress of WorldWide Missions, p. 39) states, 'On the basis of all the data available it has been estimated that by the close of the Apostolic Period the total number of Christian disciples had reached half a million.'"—William Hendriksen
